

## My road to the Priesthood

Coming home from Osterley | had an interview with Archbishop Beck the results of which was an offer of a place at 'The Pontifical English College in Lisbon, Portugal. 'Founded in 1622 during the Reformation to train priests for the missions in England. Our studies and formation would last for six years, returning home every two years.

12 students sailed with me from Southampton, a trip of three days through the Bay of Biscay to Lisbon. What a trip, everyone was seasick, no one had prepared us for the rough waters through the Bay of Biscay. We arrived in one piece at the port of Lisbon where some of the professors were waiting to take us by taxi to the Pontifical English College in 'Barrio Alto'which overlooked the city down to the port of Lisbon. Inside the college was like stepping back into history, a massive imposing 18th century building that smelt so musty. I was given a room on the top floor with a high bevelled ceiling that overlooked the port. When the Royal Navy was in harbour the college flew the White Ensign from the flat roof of the Observatory. Our community consisted of 5 priests, The President, four professors and 35 students. My first two years

was studying Philosophy with Scripture, Catechetics, Church History, Liturgy, Music, and Portuguese. Thank God all the lectures were in English!! Philosophy was tough and at every exam | sweated blood and tears but somehow survived. For recreation we explored the beautiful city of Lisbon and the beautiful seacoast of Cascaís the Portuguese Ríviera.

Our second year began with just 12 students. Some of the senior students had been struggling the year before without a Moral Theology Professor and during their summer holidays transferred to English Seminaries. This shock brought the sad news that the college was to close the following summer and our bishops wrote telling us that we were being transferred to colleges in England. Once more it was time to say goodbye to friends and colleagues and await the news of our future!
