Responsorial Psalm

R. 'Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted.'

A few days ago, a parishioner emailed me to suggest that a reflection might look at the Israeli/ Palestinian situation, how we arrived here and where we might go from here.

The present situation is simply horrendous. The Israelis see the deaths of civilians, mainly women and children, as collateral damage. Twenty-five thousand. And the great powers, especially the United States and, to a much lesser extent of influence, the UK, seem to be helpless, or unwilling, to stop it. And all sorts of other Middle East threats are gathering around it.

Besides the killing of civilians, a community of two million has had its water cut off, most of its hospitals destroyed, its sewage systems put out of action and a very large part of the population are now internal refugees as they are warned to move away from Israeli strikes of various sorts.

The immediate trigger for all of this was the appalling Hamas attacks against the Jewish communities close to Gaza. But the deep-down reason has much deeper roots, and many of them.

My sabbatical at the ecumenical institute Tantur, founded by Pope Paul VI, was designed to open the eyes of its participants to the incredible variety of religious life in the Holy Land, especially in Jerusalem, but very much to the Palestinian / Israeli situation. So, we met and listened to all shades of opinion on both sides, though there seemed to be far more shades on the Israeli side. To oversimplify, from the ultra-orthodox to the extremely liberal Jewish position. And it is important to remember that not all Jewish people are religious.

To prepare for the experience at Tantur, we were sent reading lists which tried to cover all aspects of the situation. If we thought the Northern Ireland situation was complicated and insoluble, and rooted in history, this seemed to be even more complicated, rooted in history and insoluble. So my heart sank at the thought of trying to say something that might help us understand a little more clearly the terrible present. Definitely Holy Spirit territory. It will need more than one week, I fear.

There are a number of key aspects that need to be understood, and it will be impossible to do real justice to any of them in this space, but it is important to signal them. Among them will be political Zionism, the Balfour Declaration, how did Gaza come to be Gaza, the Holocaust, and so on.
