

to our Year 6 as they sit the SAT tests next week




Dear God, please bless our year 6 children as they sit their tests. Help them to remember all they have learned.

This week Year 3 worked on their team building skills in order to make tents.




















YEAR 1 PHONICS MEETING THURSDAY 16TH MAY

KS2 children should be accessing Reading Plus from home for at least 30 mins a week (15 mins \times 2 is fine)


