# 'Love one another'

Sick and housebound parishioners have to be a priority in the parish. Our parish community is not just those who are at Mass on Sundays, but those who don't come and those who for all sorts of reasons cannot come, and the sick and housebound are very special in this latter group. One of the most important ways in which we stretch out to them is by regularly taking them Holy Communion. But there can be two obstacles to this.

The first is knowing who they are. Becoming housebound can be a slow process of being able to get out some weeks and not others, with gradually longer absences. And people get used to knowing that you cannot always make it, until, hopefully, somebody realises that it is not just a normal absence and raises questions and the parish is able to respond. Or the person her/himself lets the parish know. But as the number of priests reduces, people can be reluctant to become what they see as an extra burden and keep silent. But the parish exists as a Communion/Community and that is essentially about how we are with each other.

#### "Love one another as I have loved you".

It is said that in the early Church people joined because it was said: 'See how these Christians love one another'. The second obstacle is having enough Special Ministers to be able to respond. At the moment, the parish is very stretched in this regard. The more we have, the easier it is for everybody. It is a most rewarding ministry. It must be well over forty years now since it was introduced into this Diocese and few changes have done as much to change us as Church and as individuals in the Church. The drop from four to two priests in the parish emphasises these needs. If you have never considered offering yourself for this ministry, will you think about it now, please.
