However, if you want to get into the Wizard of Oz mood, here are some ideas

Dorothy Gale - Blue dress, red shoes, pigtails, basket with a stuffed dog.

Scarecrow – Plaid shirt, straw (or yellow paper) sticking out, floppy hat.

Tin Man – Silver/grey clothes, funnel hat, heart cutout.

Cowardly Lion – Brown clothes, DIY mane, tail, whiskers.

Glinda the Good Witch – Pink dress, sparkly crown, wand.

Wicked Witch of the West (Elphaba) - Black dress, pointy hat, green face paint.

The Wizard of Oz – Green or black suit, bow tie, top hat.

Toto – Grey or black clothes, dog ears (DIY with a headband).

Flying Monkey – Brown or grey hoodie, cardboard wings.

Munchkin – Bright, mismatched clothes, knee-high socks, oversized bow tie.

The Lollipop Guild - Striped shirt, suspenders, big lollipop (paper cutout).

The Wicked Witch's Guards ("Oh-ee-oh" guys) – Black outfit, red belt, tall black hat (paper cone).

Emerald City Citizen – All green clothes, sunglasses, and fancy hat.

A Rainbow - Colourful clothes or DIY a rainbow cape.

A Tornado - Grey outfit with cotton or fabric swirls attached, representing the storm that takes Dorothy to Oz.

1. Follow the Yellow Brick Road Treasure Hunt


Y Children collect letters to form a book-themed word. First to finish wins a prize!
