



St. John Fisher Catholic Primary School Remote Education Contingency Plan

Here at St. John Fisher we aim to continue to look after our pupil's well-being and happiness whilst delivering an ambitious and broad curriculum in all subjects.

We have extensive plans for the provision of remote education to ensure that where children need to be educated at home, for example, due to shielding, self-isolation or a local outbreak, they are given the support they need to continue learning.

Remote Education expectations:

- Remote education, where needed, will be high quality and align as closely as possible with in-school learning.
- The autumn term curriculum has been written and planned to focus on the emotional, physical and educational needs of the children. It will re-establish good progress in the essentials (phonics and reading, increasing vocabulary, writing and mathematics) with opportunities across foundation subjects to read widely, and developing the children's knowledge and vocabulary. The children will be taught a full range of subjects over the year, including sciences, humanities, the arts, physical education/sport, religious education and relationships and health education.
- Come and See lessons will continue as normal, whether in school or at home and all classes start the year covering the topic 'Family'.
- When planning, teachers will produce 2 sets of weekly plans – that are tailored to be delivered in school and a set of plans, as a contingency, that could be delivered as remote learning. These plans will mirror each other as much as possible.
- The learning will be accessed through Tapestry (Reception and Year 1) and our school website (Year 2-6). Marking and feedback will be given through the website and on Tapestry. The school will provide exercise books and equipment where required.

- Children with SEND will be provided with appropriate learning and concrete resource packs with instructions on how to use. Teachers will provide video links and tutorials if required.
- The learning activities will have a learning objective with clear explanations and teachers will contact the children daily to check understanding and progress. Any new topics will have a video explanation provided by the teacher, using Google Classroom, or via a video link provided by the teacher.

From the start of the autumn term, Oak National Academy resources are available and will complement our learning with online learning and video links – this includes SEND learning.
